Donald Patrick Glenn of The Villages, Florida, departed this earth to his heavenly home on May 5, 2022, at the age of 74. He was preceded in death by his twin brother Ronald, and his parents, Robert V. and Naomi Glenn.

Don grew up in smalltown Dupou, Illinois. An Eagle Scout and Order of the Arrow, Don attended Dupou High School where he lettered in Baseball, Football, and Basketball.

Don left Dupou in 1965 to attend Southern Illinois University in Carbondale where he was a member of Theta Xi Fraternity, served as Chairman of Spring Festival, and was fittingly recognized by the University for his outstanding service to student activities (i.e. he was fun). Don graduated in 1969 with a bachelor's degree in Marketing and soon married his college sweetheart, Mona Isbell, in June of the same year.

After Marine Officer Training in Quantico, Virginia, Don and Mona made Carbondale home. Countless friends and memories were made there, and Don touched many lives.
