



## Anthony A. Figueroa

August 30, 1932 - July 24, 2024

On July 24, 2024, Anthony Andrew Figueroa passed away peacefully surrounded by his family at his home in Leesburg Florida.

Tony was born in 1932 in New York city and was raised by his loving parents Andrew and Felicita Figueroa. Tony is the father to five children who he raised with his first wife, Joan Morgan Figueroa, who passed away in March of 1986. As a loving husband Tony was also preceded in death by Mrs. Barbara Durham Figueroa and Mrs. Barabara Barcomb Figueroa.

Tony was a proud Marine, having served in the Corps for over 20 years before retiring in 1970 as a First Sergeant. He is a true American hero having served in both the Korean and Vietnam wars and was awarded four Purple Hearts and a Bronze Star for heroism. Tony's dedication to the Marine Corps and his country continued as an active member of numerous veteran's organizations and the Casselberry Police Force.

Tony is survived by his sons William and Dominic Figueroa, his daughter Judith Nebel, 10 grandchildren and 4 great grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his son Thomas Figueroa and his daughter Gloria Figueroa.

A memorial service and reception will be held on Friday, August 23 at 11:00 am at the Corpus Christi Episcopal Church, 3430 County Road 470 West

Okahumpka, Fl 34762. An interment of ashes will be held on Saturday 24 August at 1100 am at the All Faiths Memorial Park, 1390 Park Drive, Casselberry Florida 32707. All friends and family of Anthony are welcome to attend and celebrate his life.

Tony started the Casselberry Police Reserve force under Chief Karcher, which I was apart of, he rose to the rank of Captain and was a respected law enforcement officer in all of Seminole, Orange and Volusia Counties. Tony trained hundreds and maybe more than a thousand men & women, no doubt handing down his lessons learned as a career senior Non-Commissioned Officer of the United States Marine Corp. Along with other respected old time Tax-Free Casselberrians, Joe Carney, Ray Heffernan, Terry Duffy, and my Father. Tony was a founding member of St. Augustine Catholic Church (1969) were we began meeting at the Casselberry Womans Club, then the old Seminole Cinema and eventually the Overbrook Road location today. These men and their families all, spent thousands of hours to ensure its history as a respected House of Worship today.
