



## Arnold Lee Hunsinger

June 12, 1939 - May 3, 2021

Arnold Lee Hunsinger "Al" "Arn" (81) of Savannah, GA passed away May 3, 2021. He was born June 12, 1939 in Dushore, PA.

Arn is survived by his dear wife of 59 years, Ruth Williams Hunsinger; his son David Hunsinger (Carie) of Savannah, GA; his daughter in law Nancy Hunsinger of Clermont, FL; his grandchildren, Britney, Amanda, Megan, Dayna, Jessica, Abby and Davis and 5 great grandchildren. He is also survived by his siblings, Janice Jackson, Lois Carrington (Duane), Agnes Cook (Paul), Roberta Giffen (Ernie), John Giffen (Elizabeth), James Giffen (Brenda) and his favorite Aunt Val of PA who will always be honored for singing "Old Shep" and sharing the stories on the farm to comfort him in his later years. He was preceded in death by his parents Mr. and Mrs. James Giffen, his daughter Patricia Lee Hunsinger, his son Daniel Hunsinger and his faithful support dog Missy.

Arn was a member at Morrison United Methodist Church in Leesburg, FL. He took part in the American Legion, V.F.W. and the Military Officers Association. He was also a faithful member of the Romeo Group, a Friday breakfast club at Belle Terre at Plantation subdivision in Leesburg, FL. From a young boy, Arn had the Navy in his blood. He had a boy sailor's uniform and then exchanged it for standard issue as an enlisted soldier. He served 30 years in the Navy being promoted to Warrant Officer. He served the nation in the Vietnam

conflict, being decorated with the Meritorious Unit Commendation, the Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal and Ribbon with Device, the Vietnam Service Medal along with multiple Navy Commendation Medals. Afterwards, he sought to be at sea often. Having Lighthouse clearance, he served on the U.S. Sequoia, the president's yacht. Though he had many stories, he would jest that he would "have to kill you if he told you." After his retirement from the Navy, he continued another 22 years serving in the Navy Exchange System.

Arn will always be remembered for his wit and humor. The family lived a life of laughter and music. With his lifelong experiences, he would tell his stories to friends who would beg for more. To Arn, everyone was a friend. He loved people and particularly those in his care whether family or employee. The stories are endless and he will be sorely missed.

There will be a memorial service to celebrate Arn's life Saturday, May 15 at 2:00 pm at the Beyers Funeral Home Chapel, 1123 W. Main St. in Leesburg, FL. The Reverend David Stauffer will officiate.
