When she yelled at me specifically Raven would giggle uncontrollably. I have experienced so many deaths in my lifetime and each one would have a Cardinal Bird appear shortly after the passing. In every instance there would only be one appearance and never again. In the week after her passing I encountered over 30 of them who all landed right in front of me and it made me feel good and laugh because it dawned on me like the quote from "It's a wonderful life" by Frank Capra.. "Every time a bell rings, an angel gets her wings!" The thoughts occurred to me wow. She made it into

heaven and she is taking full advantage of her new privileges and maxing them out because that was her own style. I delivered that message to her daughter and immediately the sightings stopped. I believe that it was a good message she wanted delivered to her children and grandchildren. She loved teaching Raven about all of the Disney villains and the good hearted characters. She had a broken heart and yet, she clamored on going about her life as if nothing was wrong. Her own daughter is her living Barbie and her Disney princess.
