Obituary of Charles Keesling

Charles Edward Keesling, 84, went to be with the Lord, Tuesday, July 22, 2015 at LRMC following a long fight with a chronic illness. He leaves his wife of 45 years, Bonnie (Heaton) Keesling; his sons, Charles Jr. (Chuck), David, and Noel; his daughters, Janet, Christy, and Sandra; 8 grandchildren; 5 great grandchildren; and many close friends.

Born and raised in Bristol, VA, the son of Allen and Thelma Keesling, he was a resident of Leesburg for 25 years. In his early years, Mr. Keesling helped sell ice for the family's ice plant. He went on to join the U.S. Army Engineers in the Korean War where he was wounded driving heavy machinery in the construction of air strips and command centers. He left the Army as a corporal and came back to his family's home in Orlando, FL where he began a career with his father working in the assembly and delivery of boats for CorrectCraft. Charles became a Florida Highway Patrolman for several years before ultimately moving on to a career with Shell Oil Company where he retired after 30 years of service. Upon retiring, he and Bonnie moved to Leesburg where they became active in the First Baptist Church. He coordinated the bus program for Saturday Sunday School and for First Academy, driving the children to countless sporting events and extracurricular activities. He led the Nursing

Home Ministry and music program for 11 years. Charles had a special way with animals, children, and those with special needs. He was a beloved grandfather, father, mentor, church deacon, and servant of Christ. His deep bass voice commanded respect, but he displayed a gift for kindness and his ability to instill trust in all he met. His sense of humor and selfless service to others will be missed.
