Obituary of Charles Moseley

Charles E. "Charlie" Moseley, 87, of Leesburg, passed away Thursday evening, February 21st following a long illness. Born in Birmingham, England the son of Walter & Elsie Jane(Morris) Moseley, Charlie married Gloria (Radanof) and they moved to Highland Lakes in Leesburg from California in 1992. He was a member of St. Paul's Catholic Community, an avid tennis player, and had served in the British Royal Air Force and the Royal Navy. Charlie was a retired high energy physics machinist for Stanford University. Survivors include his wife, Gloria, of Leesburg, 2 sisters, Mary Bond of Fair Oaks, England and Lillian Stanley of Walsall, England, and several nieces and nephews. He is preceded in death by his brother Stanley Moseley.
