Constance (Connie) Elizabeth Lewis, 87, of Leesburg, Florida, passed away peacefully on July 6, 2025, surrounded by her loving family.

Born in New York, NY on December 17, 1937, to William and Constance (Scott) Martin, Connie grew up in the heart of the city, attending local schools and beginning her career in secretarial and administrative roles. After moving to Florida, she worked for the South Atlantic Regional Resource Center (SARRC) in Plantation, FL and Florida Atlantic University, where she was admired for her dedication and professionalism.

Connie's most cherished role, however, was as a loving wife and devoted mother to her four boys. Connie was a meticulous homemaker. She poured her heart into raising her children, attending their sporting events, serving as their Scouting Den Mother, and ensuring that her Christian values and faith were lovingly instilled in each of them.

After retiring from Florida Atlantic University, Connie and her beloved husband of 66 years, Peter, settled in the Royal Highlands community of Leesburg, where she enjoyed an active retirement for 26 years. Connie was a spirited member of the Royal Highlands tennis club, rarely missed her Monday card group, and looked forward to monthly lunches with dear friends. Travel was one of Connie's greatest joys. Her adventures took her to nearly every state in the U.S., across Europe, and on many cruises—including memorable voyages through the Panama Canal, the Caribbean, and Alaska, the latter shared with her grandchildren. She was also renowned among family and friends for her extraordinary cooking and baking, especially during the holidays.

Connie's warmth, kindness, and fun-loving spirit touched everyone who knew her. As one friend shared, "I loved your mom. Had so much fun with her over the years... I'm remembering her for how adorable she was and fun and a great mom. You are so lucky to have had her as your mom" Another recalled, "She fought hard for many years. I have so many fond memories of her and her fun personality".

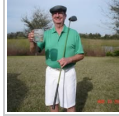
