David Keith Brooks, a man whose commanding presence and musical talents left an indelible mark on all who knew him, passed away at home surrounded by loved ones at the age of 67 on Friday, October 18, 2024, after a valiant 3-year battle with colon cancer. David was born in Greenville, SC with a gift for music and knew he was meant to share his passion with those around him. David's life was a symphony of creativity, love, and inspiration. Although his stage presence was larger than life, David was a man of few words who loved his wife, Lisa Eileen Brooks, his 7 children and his close friends with every fiber of his being.

David graduated from Stetson University, where his passion for music was exemplified through a major in voice, minor in organ playing, playing the Trumpet, and performing Opera. He graduated seminary school in Kentucky and became a Deacon at Sumterville Baptist Church. He was also a Professor and Director of Music at Lake Sumter Community College. His continuing journey in music led him to compose and illustrate eight piano books for children, with which he taught over 500 students in his career and inspired countless young musicians. He also composed and produced two albums of original music, which memorialized his deep devotion and vibrant spirit.

On January 4th, 2012, David's life was forever changed when he serendipitously met the love of his life, Lisa, online although they lived nearly

2,000 miles from each other. Their fated connection blossomed through his music and never-ending video calls; the magnetic pull of their love led to their marriage on July 7th, 2012. All who knew David know that Lisa's partnership brought him immense joy and love, and offered him acceptance that he had never felt in his life. Their love story was beautiful and was the driving force in his resilience against adversity in life and his health.

With Lisa's partnership, David became invested in his beloved band, "Bassville Park," with which he performed over 300 times across countless Florida venues, leaving audiences captivated by his dynamic performances. "Bassville Park" gave David an outlet for creativity and allowed him to connect deeply with communities across Lake County. As someone who grew up on military bases himself, David was passionate about veterans' rights and was devoted to his active membership in AmVets. He was a proud Officer of the Sons of AmVets Post 1992 in Mount Dora, a position he cherished more than most others in his life.

David was not only a virtuoso in music but also mechanically brilliant; those close to him know him as a creator, an architect, an electrician, a plumber, a farmer, and an air conditioning guru. There was no contraption too complicated to create and no item that couldn't be repaired. A true epicurean, David delighted in exploring diverse cuisines and was well known for his love of hot sauce, which he believed complemented almost any dish. David loved his All-You-Can-Eat Chicken at Sonny's, which was one of his top meals of choice for almost 40 years.

David's legacy is one imbued with passion, creativity, and hard work. He held many titles and badges, but his favorite ones were husband and father. He enriched the lives of so many through his music, teachings, and sense of humor. Though he may no longer be with us, the melodies of his life will continue to resonate in our hearts.

In addition to his beloved wife, Lisa, David is survived by his children Holly Carter, Jordan Brooks, Chelsea Rhodes, and Kayla Ramdan; his stepchildren Jordan Snooks, Brian Brooks, and Laura Snooks; nine treasured grandchildren, and his oldest brother, Ben. Additionally, he leaves behind his cherished fur babies, Schooner, Steely Dan, and Keji. He is predeceased by his parents, William and Marjorie, and his siblings Greg and Margie. He will be deeply missed by family, friends, and all who were fortunate enough to experience his remarkable presence.

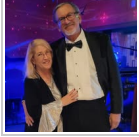
I'm just now seeing this and I'm so very sorry for your loss. He will be missed.
