Obituary of David Littleton

David Harold Littleton, 87, of Leesburg, Florida passed away October 31, 2009. Mr. Littleton was a native of Leesburg, graduate of Leesburg High School, Class of 1940, and was Florida's Outstanding 4-H Club Boy in 1940, and won a trip to the 13th National 4-H Convention in Washington D.C. where he was selected to place a wreath on the tomb of George Washington at Mt. Vernon. He was a veteran, serving in the Army Air Corps during WWII. A graduate of The American College of Banking, he worked as a Loan Officer and Assistant Vice President with Suntrust Bank for 43 1/2 years, retiring in 1984. He was a former member of the First Baptist Churches of Leesburg and Salt Springs, Florida and a member of Christ United Methodist Church of Leesburg. Mr. Littleton was the co-founder and a Past-President of both the Leesburg Heritage Society and The Mid-Lakes Orchid Society, and a Lifetime Member, Past-President and Melvin Jones Fellow of the Leesburg Lions Club.

Mr Littleton is survived by his son David H. Littleton, Jr. of Orlando, Florida; Daughters: Georgia Carole Littleton of Debarry, Florida and Marcia Littleton Kovalak of Homer City, Pennsylvania; 3 Grandchildren: Tracy Harvill, Janie Lewis, and John Kovalak; 3 great-grandchildren. Also surviving are a brother, Frank C. Littleton of Salt Springs, Florida, and a niece Sue Littleton Wakefield of Leesburg, Florida.
