At New Hope Presbyterian Church PCA, Eustis, FL she attended the Sunday Services and Thursday morning Bible Study.

She is survived by her 'big brother' David Clark and his wife, Janet Clark, Cousin Ted Waltman, his wife Jean, and their children Mark, and Brian. She was preceded in death by her parents, as well as Uncle Gerald and Aunt Katherine Waltman, Aunt Mary and Cousin George McKechnie, and Jean Bartlett, her namesake.
