Obituary of Col. Donald Butler

Colonel Donald R. Butler, 79, of Lady Lake, FL died Friday, January 15, 2010. He was born in Louisville, KY. He was a member of Crescent Hill United Methodist Church, Louisville, KY. He was a 1953 Graduate of University of Kentucky, Lexington and a member of TKE Fraternity.

He was a retired Colonel with the US Air Force with 30 years of service. He was the Assistant Flight Director for the Gemini Space Program; a B-47 Bombardier/Navigator and a KC 97 Tanker Navigator in the 509th Bomb Wing; a Commander in SAC-AD (Strategic Air Command); Assistant Flight Director for the Manned Orbiting Laboratory with NASA; Minute Man Missile Squadron Commander, SAC Inspector General Team as a Commander; Commander of the 1020 Computer Services Squadron (Space Command) at Peterson Air Force Base, Colorado Springs, CO.

He was a volunteer Ramrod with Pike's Peak or Bust Rodeo, Colorado Springs, CO. He was an active member of the Civitan Club, Active RNC member and worked as a volunteer for retired congressman Joel Hefley, CO. He enjoyed traveling especially cruising, the arts, music, and horseshows. He

volunteered with the Boy Scouts and Little League and was commissioned a Kentucky Colonel. He enjoyed hunting, fishing and special times with his wife, children and grandchildren.

He is survived by wife, Ellinda Butler, Lady Lake, FL; 2 sons: Brent Butler (Shirley) Omaha, NE and Brian Butler (Louann), Loma Linda, CA; daughter, Ann-Margaret Morgan, Wills Point, TX; grand daughter, Laura Vance, Omaha, NE; great grand daughter, Lindsay Vance, Omaha, NE.
