Obituary of Dorothy Anderson

Dorothy M. Anderson, of Yalaha, was born the daughter of Casper and Carrie Arneson in Cadott, Wisconsin on December 18, 1926 and died Thursday, July 5, 2012 in Leesburg. She was a 1944 graduate of Cadott High School.

Dorothy married Mervil Anderson of Stanley, WI on October 5, 1946 and they moved to Florida from Stanley in 1959. Mervil preceded her in death January 30, 1998. She was a teacher's aide at Fruitland Park School for 8 years and a clerk at the Yalaha Post Office for 13 years. Dorothy was a 4-H leader and the Historian for the Yalaha Fire Department. She was a charter member of Bethany Lutheran Church, Leesburg and held several offices in the Women's Guild. Dorothy was a Past Regent in the Women of the Moose, Leesburg #1034 and a member of the Fraternal Order of the Eagles, Aerie #4273.
