Obituary of DOROTHY WERTH

Werth, Dorothy Gene Carll, 90 passed away on Thursday, May 29th at Lake View Terrace, Altoona, Florida. Dorothy was born Dec 5, 1923 in Camden, New Jersey to the late Robert Heath Carll and Dorothy Holl Davis. She married Richard Thomas Werth on February 17, 1968 in Chicago, IL He preceded her in death in 2013. McPharlin. Dorothy graduated from Scotch Plains High School, New Jersey in 1942. While in high school, she trained to become a pilot and at the age of 17 flew a single engine plane. After high school she worked at the Newark Air Port before enlisting in the Army Air Force. She served in WWII as a WAC at Randolph Field, Texas and was honorably discharged from the 2532nd Army Air Force Base Unit at Fort Sam Houston, Texas as a Corporal in July 1946. In 1950 Dorothy began her career with Borg-Warner, Chicago, Illinois in the international sales division and enjoyed the details and exactness of the job. She retired from Borg-Warner in 1990 and moved to Ocala, Florida with her husband, Richard. As a child, Dorothy loved spending winters at the home of her grandparents in Miami Beach. She often recalled those happy times.

Dorothy loved animals and always had pets in her home. She was devoted to

animal welfare and was known to take in a few strays during her life. She was an avid philatelist and until recently was active sorting, trading and acquiring stamps for her collection. Dorothy was active with the American Legion and the VFW and was a life member of both organizations.
