Doug graduated from Battle Creek High School in 1959. He attended and graduated from the United States Military Academy in 1963

After retiring as a Lieutenant Colonel in 1963, he served an additional 20 years in the intelligence community with the CIA, General Electric, Mitre and SAIC.

Doug graduated with a degree with an MS in Electrical Engineering from the University of Michigan in 1972.

Doug was well known, highly regarded and was in great demand by his colleagues in the intelligence community.

After retiring Doug and Carol moved to The Villages where he was active in the Parrot Head Club, played golf, and traveled with Carol.
