Retired Chief MSGT Edward J. Creamer 91, of Eustis passed away Sunday September 08, 2013. Born in Dalton Massachusetts he moved to Eustis from Hampton, Virginia in 1977. Retired with 35 years of service from the US Air Force. He served in WWII, Korean War, and Vietnam War. He was also a recipient of the Purple Heart.
