Edward F. "Butch" Koehn, of Mallory Square in The Villages passed away peacefully at home surrounded by his family after a short fight with lung cancer.

Ed was born February 16, 1945 in Columbus, Ohio to Robert E. Sr. and Edna L. (Corriveau) Koehn. He graduated in 1963 from St. Mary High School in Warren, Ohio.
