She is survived by her brother Jim Levesque

and wife Lisa. She and her husband lived  
in NH after their marriage, and later moved  
to VA where they raised their children.

In 1998 they moved to FL where they cared

Thrift Store where she entertained both  
volunteers and customers with her warm  
humor and indomitable spirit. She  
regularly counseled others who experienced  
the challenges of cancer, giving them hope,  
courage and strength as she fought her  
own 20 year battle.
