Elizabeth Tyler Hogan was born July 20, 1919, in Macon, Georgia to Herbert William Tyler and Elizabeth Collier Tyler. She was the youngest of three children, two brothers, Bill and Fred, who predeceased her.

The family soon moved to Florida where her father joined the Florida Methodist Conference. Growing up in a Methodist parsonage, there were many moves and schools. She graduated for Carrabelle High School and then attended Florida Southern College in Lakeland, Florida. Upon graduation from there with a degree in Home Economics, she went to work as a dietitian at Brewster Hospital in Jacksonville, Florida.

She moved from there to teach Home Economics at Melrose High School in Melrose, Florida. While in Melrose she met and married E.J. Hogan. They celebrated 61 years of marriage before he died in 2009. the state through her contacts at the camp. She was honored with a life membership in United Methodist Woman. She devoted many hours in service to the churches, Morrison Memorial in Leesburg and Fruitland Park United Methodist Church.
