He was an accomplished choral conductor and pianist. I enjoyed playing impromptu duo-piano sessions in his home and, when he was still in New Jersey, in mine. His apparent inventiveness at the keyboard was often the result of hours of practice, but sometimes just his exuberant joy of playing. When he wasn't making music, he enjoyed golf, which seems to be the neighborhood pastime in The Villages.
