Obituary of Fern Buckley

Fern Buckley, 94, of Leesburg, Florida, passed away peacefully while at Leesburg Regional Medical Center after a brief illness on Monday, March 26, 2012. She was a school teacher for 25 years, having taught at Fruitland Park Elementary and Skeen Elementary schools, and was one of the first visiting teachers for Lake County. She was a member of a teaching sorority, Alpha Delta Kappa and 93rd member of the Lake Co. Teachers Credit Union. She attended Bowling Green University in Ohio and Florida State University. She received her B.A. from the University of Florida and was a hardcore Gator fan until she took her very last breath. Her main football love was Tim Tebow.

Her husband of 65 years, Maurice J. Buckley, preceded her in death in 2004. She is survived by her four children, Maurine Buckley of Apopka, FL, Jill Shook of Leesburg, FL, Jack Buckley of Great Barrington, MA, and Brenda Buckley of Seaside, CA; four grandchildren, Donna Murphy, Caleb Gilbert, Michael Shook, and Alexander Pavelka; great grandson, Samuel Gilbert and great granddaughter, Hailey Jewel Shook Bosier.
