and friends before Charles passed away in 2008.

From the early age of four, Frances showed signs of

unique musical talent. Her love and passion for playing

the piano eventually led her to become a concert pianist.

Because of Frances' musical talent early on, she spent

many hours in her community church in Lewistown at the

United Methodist Church, playing the organ and piano.

Later in life, she traveled the world playing in symphonies
and at universities.
