Frank C. Corbin died at his home in The Villages November 17, 2018. He was born in Syracuse, New York on September 22, 1938 to Frank Sr. and Nelly (Gallinger) Corbin. He graduated from Bainbridge High School in Bainbridge, New York and Syracuse University where he majored in music education. Frank taught music in schools in New York State. He enjoyed teaching where he could encourage his students to sing, play instruments and appreciate music. His students were featured in annual musical programs. Summers would find him at the Gas Light Village in Story town in Glen Falls, New York where he entertained as an actor, narrator, singer and player of a bass viol, guitar, banjo and piano.

When Frank retired in 1994, he moved to The Villages, Florida. He continued to be active in various organizations where he played in softball leagues, sang in choruses and choirs, acted in theater productions, took languages, music and art courses in the Enrichment Academy, volunteered as a judge for The Villages middle and high school science fair and continue to impact young people's lives by tutoring English and several music activities. Frank had an active life hunting, skiing, golfing, acting, singing, being a citizen band radio operator, learning new things and playing musical instruments. He often said, "this is the life, folks.
