Frank Joseph Mirovsky, 92, of Leesburg, FL was born July 24, 1924 in New York City and passed away June 2, 2017. Mr. Mirovsky was a veteran of the US Army who proudly served his country during WWII. He was longtime resident of Cedar, MN before moving to Leesburg in 1998. He was active locally as a member of the Leesburg Heritage Society and a docent at the Mote-Morris House.
