Frank J. Sedlasek passed away peacefully in his sleep on May 12, 2026, at the age of 82. Born in Maribor, Slovenia, on December 9, 1943, Frank emigrated to Chicago before putting down roots in Schaumburg, Illinois, where he would spend over 40 years building a marriage and a family. His journey was one marked by courage, determination, and a boundless affection for those he held dear.

Frank was the cherished son of Frank and Mary Sedlasek, who, along with his sister Irene Pecaric, have preceded him in death.

He is survived by his beloved wife of 58 years, Lois, who stood by his side through it all. Together, they built a family that became the cornerstone of their lives. Frank is also survived by his daughters, Nancy (Walter) Magiera and Debbie (Rich) Myszynski, who carry his legacy in their hearts. In 1963, Frank enlisted in the United States Marine Corps, serving with honor through some of the hardest years of the Vietnam War. He rose to the rank of Sergeant, earned the Bronze Star and other commendations for his courageous service and dedication to his fellow Marines.

After serving, he channeled that same tenacity into building several successful businesses of his own in tool and die casting, manufacturing, and technology. He was known for his generosity and willingness to help others, values he passed on to his family along with a deep sense of integrity and compassion.
