Fred Andrew Morrison is a native of Leesburg, Florida. Born May 25, 1954, Fred lived his whole life in Leesburg, working for many years at McLin Burnsed, in the same building he was born in. He passed away in Leesburg on December 4, 2021 at the age of 67. He graduated from Leesburg High School in 1972, and went on to receive an Associate of Arts degree magna cum laude in 1974 from Lake-Sumter Community College, a Bachelor of Arts, with High Honors from the University of Florida in 1976 and a Juris Doctor from the University of Florida College of Law, with High Honors, in 1979. He was admitted to the Florida Bar in 1979 and has practiced with McLin & Burnsed P.A. for 43 years, starting as a summer clerk and ending as a senior partner. He is a member of Phi Theta Kappa, Phi Kappa Phi and Order of the Coif, as well as the Lake County Bar Association, where he served as Secretary for a number of years. He is also a member of The Florida Bar, the Local Government Law Section and the Real Property, Probate and Trust Law Sections of The Florida Bar. Locally, he has served as President of the Leesburg Jaycees and as President of Hospice of Lake & Sumter Inc., where he continues as Director Emeritus. More than just a professional, Fred was also a massive fan of the Florida Gators, attending every home game each year with his family. He loved the outdoors, especially the coast, where he spent many vacations with his family either at various beaches around Florida or in Homosassa trying to catch the big one. Lastly he was a great musician, playing both the organ at St Paul's and the guitar as "Secret Agent Man". He

is survived by his wife Susan, daughter Isabella, and son Nicholas. Fred's funeral will be Saturday, December 11, 2021 at 3pm. It will take place at Morrison Methodist Church in downtown Leesburg, and there will be a reception to follow at the Leesburg Boat Club.
