



Fredrick R. Mularsky

February 4, 1960 - January 19, 2021

Fredrick R "Freddie" Mularsky, 60, of Leesburg, Florida passed away January 19, 2021. He was born February 4, 1960 and was a native of Leesburg, graduating from Leesburg High School where he later taught. Many remember him for leading the 'East to West" cheer at Pep Rallies. A larger than life personality, he had a smile for everyone and was known by most around Leesburg where he was active in the community. He retired with 30 years of service in Lake County Schools and operated Getzel's Department Store in downtown Leesburg until its closing in 2019. Additionally Freddie was a cornerstone in Congregation Beth Shalom, the Jewish congregation his father Getzel founded.

Survivors include: son Nathan and Wife Emilie Mularsky of Tavares; daughter Marissa Mularsky of Lecanto, FL; grandson Joshua Mularsky. He was preceded in death by his parents Rabbi Getzel and Betty Mularsky and brother, Melvin Mularsky.

A Funeral Service will be held on Friday January 22, 2021 in the chapel of Beyers Funeral Home in Leesburg beginning at 11 AM. Interment will follow at Hillcrest Memorial Gardens, Leesburg.
