Georgiana Robinson Morris, 93, died at home on December 17, 2019, of natural causes. A devoted mother, steadfast friend and maker of the World's Best Carrot Cake, she was pre-deceased by her husband, Robert J. Morris, Sr. The couple enjoyed many years of traveling in their Airstream, visiting acquaintances far and wide, spending time with their family whenever possible and, of course, Gator football.

Born in Lawton, Oklahoma, on February 19, 1926, Georgiana was the daughter of John Robinson, a mailman, and his wife, Trula, a librarian. She studied home economics at Cameron College and met her future husband when he was stationed at Fort Sill, in Lawton, during World War II. They wed after the war and she moved to Leesburg in 1946, where her husband was in the fern business. Georgiana was an active member of St. James Episcopal Church and served on the vestry.

Georgiana is survived by three sons, Bob (Debbie), Winter Park; Skellie, Leesburg; Danny (Nancy), Yalaha; a daughter, Carol Ann Morris-Smith (Pen), Pittman; six grandchildren, and four great-grandchildren.
