



Hollis P Smothers

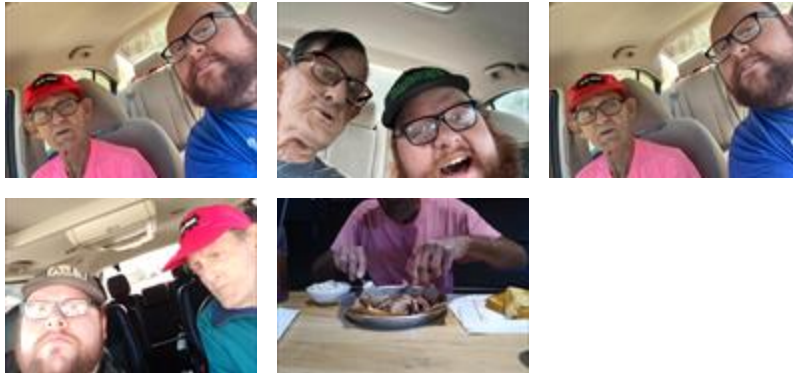
April 23, 1944 - April 27, 2022
