Horst A. Uhlich, 78, of Leesburg, passed away Wednesday, June 26th at his residence. He was born April 25th 1935 in Neidenburg, East Prussia(Germany) the son of Max & Hedwig(Boree)Ulich. He was married to Eva Marianne(Beier)Uhlich and they moved to the United States in 1971 to New York and moved to Leesburg in 2004.

Horst was a member of Bethany Lutheran Church, Leesburg where he was very active and a committed Christian. He had been a coal miner, fisherman merchant marine,owner of a dry cleaning business and a building superintendent/manager. He had volunteered with the Captive Nation Committee for the restoration of their homeland for over forty years serving as President and Chairman since 1978. Survivors include his wife Eva, a brother, Gerhardt Uhlich and sister, Eva Water, both of Germany.
