Obituary of Ingeborg Brown

Ingeborg C. Brown, nee Altrichter, 91, The Villages, FL died on September 2, 2013. Mrs. Brown was born in Schweidnitz, Germany, September 20, 1921 and moved to The Villages, FL in 1994. She was the widow of Cecil H. Brown of Jacksonville, FL, and retired from Federal Service in April, 1994. For 5 years she was a shipment clerk at the Jacksonville Naval Air Station, and for 20 years was stationed with the Army at Munich, Germany.
