Irene Luke Chew was born May 16, 1920 in Shanghai, China to William Kee Luke of Maui, Hawaii and Grace Yee of Honolulu, Hawaii. Her father was working in China at the time of her birth. She traveled extensively between China and Hawaii in her youth. After graduating from high school she attended Saint John's University in Shanghai (affiliated with the University of Pennsylvania) graduating with a degree in education. She was evacuated from Shanghai in 1949 when President Harry Truman sent ships to evacuate American citizens from China after the communist take over of the country. (It has long been a family joke that she was late for the last boat out of China.) She married William Chew whom she met in Honolulu in Durham, N.C. where he was attending post graduate studies in medicine at Duke University. She moved to Orlando, Florida when William Chew received a position at Florida Sands hospital. She moved to Leesburg in 1957 when William Chew joined the Durham Young Clinic. She was an active member of the First Presbyterian church in Leesburg until 2013 when she moved to University Place in Houston, TX. She passed away from pneumonia one month before her 100 birthday and is laid to rest beside her husband in Hillcrest cemetery, Leesburg.
