Obituary of James Lyall

James Paul Lyall, 76, died Thursday, December 2, 2010 at his home after battling cancer. Born in Poughkeepsie, NY he was the son of Henry and Margaret Powers Lyall. Jim graduated from Lynbrooke H.S. and then from Villanova University. He attended Catholic University to achieve a Master's Degree in Education and also was awarded the National Science Foundation Grant in 1969 at Boston College. He also served honorably in the Armed Forces. Jim lived in Upper Marlboro, MD with his wife of 42 years, Barbara, where he was a mathematic teacher and supervisor for Prince George's County Schools. He retired to Leesburg, FL in 2000. He was preceded in death by his brother Henry Lyall. Jim is survived by his loving wife Barbara Koester Lyall; brothers John and Kevin Lyall; children Michael Lyall (married to Arianna Hendrickson of Navato, CA) and Megan Lyall Kueny (married to Joseph Kueny of Conshohocken, PA); grandchildren Ava Lyall, Jake Lyall, Jack Kueny and Mick Kueny. Jim was a loving husband, an attentive father and a patient teacher. His generosity and unwavering faith in God were an inspiration to others. In Leesburg he was a member of St. Paul's Catholic Church.
