### Obituary of James Neeld

James "Jimmy" Neeld of Lady Lake, FL. passed away peacefully at home Monday Sept. 24, 2012 in the company of family and under the care of Cornerstone Hospice after a battle with brain cancer. He was 63.

James was born in Trenton, NJ on April 10, 1949 to Robert and Mary Neeld and spent most of his life in Bucks County. He grew up in Morrisville, PA and attended Pennsbury High School where he was a standout athlete. "Jimbo", as he was known by many friends and teammates, was a three sport athlete who lettered in Baseball, Basketball and Football. His achievements and contributions in these sports were recognized by the school in 2010 when he was inducted into the Pennsbury High School Hall of Fame. He continued his athletic career and developed a love for golf at Appalachian State University before returning to the Bucks County area.

Jim spent most of his adult life living in Upper Bucks County as a heavy equipment operator, although much of his free time was spent on the golf course or with his friends at the Amber Inn watching the Green Bay Packers. He retained many lifelong friendships and developed new ones with ease,

because everyone who came in contact with Jimmy Neeld was better for it.

James was a devoted son to his parents Robert and Mary Neeld, younger brother to Robert David and wonderful father to Zachary Hastie. He was preceded in death by his father Robert and is survived by mother Mary, brother Robert David and his son Zachary.

Following the death of his father, Jimmy moved to Florida to care for his mother. Ironically, Mary ended up providing care for him after he developed brain cancer. With the help of excellent care from Cornerstone Hospice and his son Zachary, James passed peacefully and without pain in his own bed.
