Mrs. Jane Everline Blaine died Sunday, April 11, 2010. She was born in Frostburg, Maryland November 15, 1919, daughter of Mary and Sam Everline and sister of the late Athalia Everline. “ Dear Jimmy, I doubt you will remember me. Gary and I graduated from UHS together. In later years I became better acquainted with your mom. She was quietly & powerfully supportive to me. I get The Outpost several weeks late and just learned that Mrs. Blaine died. In the late 1980's Gary came to Florida for a visit. We went to the dog track and ended up at your parent's house for dinner. I was moved and very touched by your mother's graciousness. Several years later, I was Pete Getchell's nurse and one day was simply overcome with sadness about his impending death. Driving blindly, roaming around Three Lakes I came across your mom. She was obviously trying to do some yard work but climbed into my truck to chat. My sister died later and I recalled her words. When Gary died, I was already in Idaho and my mother called to tell me. I called your mom and she and I had essentially the same conversation we'd had when Pete was dying. Your quiet little mother was very special and I offer my most sincere sympathy for your loss.
