John Churchill Tyler, 77, of Fruitland Park, FL (and formally of Wildwood, FL), was born April 5, 1942 in Hot Springs, AR to Nathaniel and Elizabeth Tyler. He died September 23, 2019 at his Fruitland Park residence.
