Lavergne T. DeNobile age 85 of Bradenton, Florida passed away peacefully on Wednesday, April 15, 2020.

She was born in Newburgh, NY to Walter and Catherine (Green) DeWitt. The oldest of three daughters, she attended Newburgh Free Academy. After high school she worked as an x-ray technician at St. Luke's Hospital, where she met and later married Vincent DeNobile.

In addition to raising their four children, Lavergne was an active volunteer in organizations such as Jaycette's, Camp Fire Girls, Cub Scouts, and a Hospital Auxiliary member at both Wentworth Douglas and Frisbie Memorial Hospitals.
