“ I met Linda in June, 2019 when we were both getting radiation treatments, We saw each other every day for 3 weeks. We had that "instant connection" that I've had happen only a few times. We chatted while waiting for treatments- it was amazing how much you can learn about each other in 10-15 minutes. She bragged on her family and showed pictures of her German grandchildren to all of us. Her local grandsons came with her occasionally so I got to meet them. She sure loved her family and just beamed when telling stories. She was very grateful for all the support she received from her family and her workplace. The last time we got together for lunch was early December. We laughed a lot, compared hair do's (whose hair was growing back faster- hers), whose nails we're recovering faster (mine) and enjoyed being alive. She knew there was a chance the cancer had returned and her concern was for her family. I didn't see her after that, but we did text and talk on the phone occasionally to keep tabs on each other.

Linda was a special woman and I am blessed to have known her, even for a short time. I know her suffering has ended, and I pray her family's suffering is tempered with all the wonderful memories you have of happier times.
