Linda attended Saint Phillip elementary school and graduated from Hartley high school as the salutatorian of the class of 1969. She received three full scholarships to college and a full academic scholarship to The Ohio State University. She became drill team commander on the angel flight drill team and also flight attendant on the University airlines. She graduated from OSU in 1973 with a degree in bachelor of science in education.
