Obituary of Lucille Hancock

Lucille McLeod Hancock, 94, went home to be with her Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, on Thursday, October 9, 2014 at her beloved home, OakShore, on the south shore of Lake Griffin in Leesburg, FL.

She was born May 24, 1920 in Aucilla, FL (Jefferson County) the 5th child and 2nd daughter of Dr. Norman Wightman McLeod and his wife Amanda Jane Bishop McLeod. She was very proud to be a multi-generational native Floridian and the daughter of a true "horse & buggy" physician who served the citizens of north Florida for over 50 years. Her grandfather, William Henry Harrison McLeod, served in the Florida Senate in the mid 1800's from Hamilton County.

Mrs. Hancock graduated from Aucilla High School where she played power forward (at 5'3"!) on the girls' basketball team. She was a graduate of Florida State College for Women where she was a member of the Delta Zeta Sorority. However...she was an avid Gator sports Fan! She worked for the Jefferson County Court and, later, a geological company in Tallahassee prior to her marriage.

She was married to her childhood love, W.R. "Buster" Hancock (who died in 2000) for 54 years and was a Lake County farm wife since 1948 helping him to build a thriving citrus growing business. Together they were parents of daughter, Glenna Hancock, and sons, W.R. "Chops" Hancock (Diana), Douglas Hancock and Jeffrey Hancock (Kathy). She was known as "MaMaLu" to her 9 grandchildren and 1 great grandson and everyone else for that matter! She is also survived by her sister, Jane Summitt, of Daytona Beach and numerous nieces and nephews. Grateful appreciation is also extended to her loving Caregivers, Lisa Malliard & Jackie Hinman, who made every day very special for her, as well as, Neal Vriesema her, Jack-of-all-Trades, who kept her OakShore in pristine condition.
