



## Margaret Wyks

February 4, 1924 - December 20, 2022

Margaret Louise (Nee Storer) Wyks, known as Peg, passed away on December 20th 2022. Born on February 4th 1924, Peg lived a full and productive life. She was raised in Trenton, New Jersey on Pennington Road. A graduate from Trenton State Teachers College, she met and married her high school sweet heart, John Rudolph Wyks.

They raised a family of four children and she started her career as a Librarian while the youngest was still at home in Stanton, Delaware. Peg was the Librarian for Sterck School for the Deaf in Newark, Delaware and upon retirement to Fenwick Island, Delaware she became involved with the South Coastal Library in Bethany, Delaware. Her involvement there included getting the library designed, built and furnished. She moved to The Villages in Florida in 2002 and again found time to volunteer with The Friends of The Villages Library, while setting up and running the Library in her church at North Lake Presbyterian Church. Her move to Lake Port Square saw her taking charge of that facility's library.

Aside from work in libraries, Peg loved to quilt and spent many hours creating quilts to donate to worthy charities and as gifts to family and friends. All her work was created by hand stitching, using her hand frame. In her later years, her vision made this work very tedious, yet she helped others by doing backing and batting.

When her time came she was under hospice care at the assisted living facility at Brookdale Palm Coast following a week's stay in the Advent Hospital in

Palm Coast. Her diagnosis there was a sticking valve in the heart, but at the age of 98 the operation was inadvisable.

Her passing will reunite Peg with her beloved husband, Jack, in the National Cemetery at Bushnell, Florida on what marks their 78th wedding anniversary, April 7th 2023. She is survived by her four children: John R. Wyks Jr., Edward E. Wyks, Diane Davis, and Beth Svelnis; along with six grandchildren and numerous great-grandchildren.
