Obituary of Marjorie LaBue

Marjorie Lou Cox LaBue, a 24 year resident of the Villages and member of St. Timothy's Roman Catholic Community, passed away after a long illness on December 14, 2012, at the age of 89. She was a Girl Scout Leader and avid supporter of the activities of her children and grandchildren, attending their concerts, recitals, and encouraging them and cheering them on in everything they did. She was especially fond of their

musical abilities.

She worked as a Payroll Clerk and Pay Master at St. John's University. After retirement, she moved to Florida and became an active participant in her community and her Church. She devoted many hours to setting up a computer system for the St. Vincent de Paul Society and dearly loved working with that group as a founding member. She was part of a square dancing group, Bible study, De Colores, and prayer groups, and she particularly loved getting together with friends to play chickenfoot and dominoes. She excelled at everything she did, and did it all with a smile and positive outlook.
