Raymond S. Borowicz, 93, of Fruitland Park, FL, was born October 2, 1920 in Buffalo, NY and passed away June 26, 2014. He was a Veteran of the US Navy and was an educator and baseball coach as well as a professional baseball player. From 1941-1942, he played shortstop and pitched in the New York Yankees organization. He later taught and coached at Huntington High school in NY, coached at the University of Buffalo, and served as a pitching coach for the Burlington Indians (Cleveland Indians). Locally, Mr. Borowicz attended St. Paul's Catholic Church in Leesburg. He enjoyed the outdoors and loved camping.
