Obituary of Richard Alliss

Richard F. Alliss, age 80, passed away on March 24, 2012. Rich was born to Robert and Helen Alliss on July 5, 1931 in Rensselaer, Indiana. Rich graduated from Brook High School in Brook, Indiana in 1949 and then enlisted in the Navy. He served on the USS Tarawa (CV-40) in the Korean War. Upon his return, Rich attended vocational school and became a licensed plumber. He built his own home and eventually started his own plumbing and heating contracting company, from which he retired to Leesburg, Florida. Rich was a long time member of the American Legion, including as an Executive Board Member. He was a 32nd degree Mason of the Blue Lodge and a member of the Shiners. He was lifetime member of the Eagles, actively involved in the Leesburg post. Rich was an active fisherman and a good friend. Rich is preceded in death by his brother, Robert Alliss. He is survived by his brother and sister-in-law, William and Dana Alliss of Winamac, Indiana, his sisters, Margaret Miller of Kentland, Indiana and Barbara Regen of DeMotte, Indiana, his son and daughter-in-law, Dwayne and Judy Alliss, his daughter and son-in-law, Rita (Alliss) and Kevin Powers, and his grandchildren, Shane and Jordan Alliss and Jake and Tillie Powers.
