Obituary of Richard Newman

Richard O. "Dick" Newman, 87 of Leesburg, died Wednesday, June 03, 2015. He was born in Winter Haven, FL on November 1, 1927. Dick moved to Leesburg in 1939 where he was the Captain of the football and boxing team at Leesburg High School. He received his Engineering Degree from University of Florida and started Newman Consulting Engineering in 1961 and retired in 2003. He was an Army Veteran of the Korean Conflict.

Dick was a member of the Leesburg Noon Rotary Club, a 50 year member of the Masonic Lodge #58, Leesburg and a member of the First Presbyterian Church of Leesburg. He also was on the Leesburg Planning and Zoning Board for 15 plus years and also served as Chairman. He enjoyed shooting, played tennis and golf.

He is survived by his daughter, Claire Sparks, New Smyrna Beach, FL; son, Rick (Amy) Newman, Leesburg; brother, Kenneth Newman, Richmond, VA; and 1 grandson, Michael (Jessica) Sparks, Edgewater, FL. Dick was preceded in death by his loving wife, Paulina.
