Obituary of RICHARD WAGNER

Richard (Dick) Kent Wagner, 75, of Umatilla passed away on September 4, 2012. He was a member of the First United Methodist Church of Umatilla. He was born in Glen Ridge, New Jersey on April 17, 1937, the son of the late Ernest and Mayme (Chapman) Wagner and grew up in Nutley, NJ.

After graduating from Gettysburg College he joined the Air Force and served for 6 years flying C-130s. He then became a commercial airline pilot, beginning his career with Pan American Airlines in Miami where he met his wife. He served 20 years with Pan Am and then 11 years with United Airlines before retiring as a captain of the 747. He has been recognized by the Smithsonian National Air and Space Museum's Wall of Honor for his contribution to aviation.

He was a Florida resident for over 47 years and resided in Umatilla for the past 30 years. He enjoyed golf and tennis, flying his private plane, both water and snow skiing, tending to his home and farm, and spending time with his family.

He is survived by his loving wife of 44 years, Connie; 2 daughters, Cheryl (Ryan) Goldwire, and Denise (Scott) Dambrose; a son, David; 3 sisters, Joan Beim, Janet (Henry) Youngster, and Linda (Pete) Luxton; 7 grandsons; and a granddaughter.

He was preceded in death by a sister Verna and husband Al Sorber; brother Bill; and brother-in-law Mitchell Beim.
