He sold used cars in Dona Vista, and eventually partnered up with Jack Roberts and together they built high quality homes all over Lake County. He bought 6 acres on a lake, built his forever home, where he was able to stay until his death. Bob was a man who loved his family, experimenting with new recipes, managing and making money and Florida State Football. He loved to argue politics with anyone that would listen, and was sad that he wouldn't get to see the next election.

Bob is survived by his wife, Jackie Hatcher, son Rick Vincent (Janice),
