Obituary of Robert Brouillet

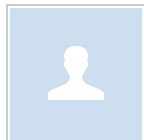
Robert Brouillet passed away on September 21, 2013 after a short illness, surrounded by his family. He is survived by his loving wife, Sharon Brouillet, his children, Michael (Terry) and Michelle (Ross), and his adoring grandchildren: Ross, Kate, Beth, and Nicole. One of 11 kids; he is loved by his siblings and many relatives. He resided in Simsbury, CT and recently retired to The Villages, FL. Bob was a competitive runner; running for UMASS and the Marine Corps. He was the first men's cross-country athlete in UMass history to qualify for the NCAA championship. He set seven new course records and won the Yankee conference title for 3 consecutive years. He ran internationally for the Marine Corps, and among many accolades won the All Marine 5000 meters Championship. He held both institutions with great respect as well as the lifelong friendships he made with fellow teammates and servicemen. As a Vietnam veteran he will be buried at the Florida National Cemetery, Bushnell, FL in honor of his commitment to his country. He was a talented artist and writer, and enjoyed pursuits such as golf and traveling. Most of all he will always be remembered for being a loving husband, father, and grandfather. He will be missed and remembered with great love and admiration by those who knew him.
