Robert F. "Bobby" Einstein, Sr., 83, of Leesburg, Florida passed away March 14, 2017. A native Floridian, he was born April 27, 1933 in Sanford, Florida and moved to Leesburg from DeLand in 1946. He was a US Army Veteran who honorably served his country during the Korean War. Bobby was a retired manager of A&P Foods, working for 25 years before opening Bobby's Grocery, which he owned and operated for 11 years. He then went to work for Beyers Funeral Home and Crematory as a Funeral Home Assistant for 17 years.
