On August 24, 2023, Robert (Rob) Fleming passed away at Leesburg Regional medical Center. Rob was recovering from a fall which required 2 surgeries. His recovery was progressing well. He was treated for an infection, while in a rehabilitation center, it was thought to be cleared so was discharged home. He was trained in electronics/radio/radar on navy jets. When he was discharged he continued to work in the field. Early in his career, he started his own electronic repair shop and married Shirley. During the following years, he worked at McDonald Douglas, established new radio

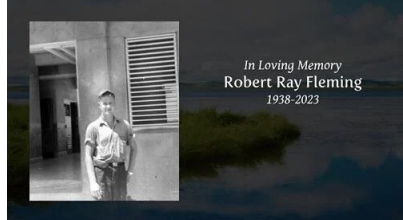
