Robert R. Neideck, 89, of Altoona, Florida died peacefully at Lakeview Terrace Retirement Community on Thanksgiving afternoon November 27, 2025. On a day which is celebrated by giving thanks, his family was able to thankfully remember Robert's (Bob's) good life of service, ministry and his love of Jesus who now holds Bob in his arms.

Bob was born in Detroit, Michigan on October 8, 1936 to Raymond and Inez (Raley) Neideck. He met his future wife, Margaret (Simpson) Neideck 71 years ago while playing softball on a team coached by her brother Dan. On August 2, 1958 he married Margaret and they recently celebrated their 67th wedding anniversary.

He attended Detroit Business Institute and Wayne State University before beginning employment as an accountant at General Motors. He also spent eight years serving in the U.S. Navy reserves. In the late 1960s, Bob and Margaret served in the mission field together with their family in Manilla, The Philippines, working with Far Eastern Gospel Crusade.

In 1969, he accepted a call to serve as the Campus Bookstore Manager at Taylor University in Upland, Indiana. In 30 years of service there he had a tremendous impact on the lives of many students, faculty and staff members, before retiring in 1999. His years in Upland also consisted of being a big

supporter of all his children's and grandchildren's athletics and activities.

Bob spent many years teaching Sunday School in his church, coaching Little League baseball and participating in Wandering Wheels bicycle trips around the globe. Once retired, he continued ministering in local hospitals as an encourager to patients.

Bob was preceded in death by his son, David Neideck; his parents, Raymond and Inez Neideck; and his brothers, Richard Neideck and Neil Neideck.

He is survived by his wife, Margaret Neideck; children, Robert Neideck Jr (Susan), Steven Neideck (Kimberley), and Christine Weiss (Roderick); along with 8 grandchildren and 7 great grandchildren.
